Timmy just started racing cars this April. He attended his first SCCA driver's school at Daytona International Speedway in April 2012. SCCA requirement is to complete two driver schools before you can enter a race. In the class room the instructor told everyone in the room to follow the **59** car, "*Tim's Car*" he's the only one that knows where the racing line is.

At the end of the first day of school, he blew the engine. At 7:30pm that night his Dad found a used junkyard engine 50 miles away. While Tim attended the classroom, his Mom and Dad went to pick up the used engine. They arrived at the race shop around 11:30pm with the engine, and Tim and his Dad stayed up all night replacing the engine. They arrived back at the track, junkyard oil still in the engine, around 8am with no sleep whatsoever.

At the end of the first school they have a school race, Prior to the race, Tim's driving instructor asked Tim to follow him in the race and he would be OK, Tim couldn't stay behind his instructor "Too Slow" in the race, and Tim passed him never to see him again. He came in first place in his class for the race with a used junkyard engine. Due to his performance the Chief Stewart waved the second school requirement.

Tim's first race was May 5th at Daytona International Speedway, the full Rolex 24 Hour road course, he finished second in his first race, and was running second in the 1-½ hour Enduro until the transmission failed. We borrowed a transmission from a competitor, (Thank You Marc Dana) and he finished second in the last race. setting the race's fastest lap time.

Tim's next race was June 6th at the Sebring International Raceway, there were three races that weekend. He finished first in all three races, and set a new track record. In the last race, Tim spun off the track and stalled the car, he got the


car restarted and caught the leaders and won the race.

District 1 meeting - 28 members in attendance at Perkins restaurant.

The June event at Sebring went well, and that may be due in part to luck. The schedule was a bit too tight for reality. Fortunately, all the bad weather went through on Friday, and we did not have any major incidents to contend with.

The **Social/Cookout** at the Kenilworth was a big success, and was praised as the **best food ever** for that event. We did not run out of food or beverage. The leftover food went to a local shelter. While we are very fortunate to enjoy the fellowship of our club, remember there are people all around who are struggling to survive.

The national website has information about how that board has approved some competition class changes. This is mostly combining some classes to thin the overall number of classes.

If you are an established competitor who does not compete at the national points level, this may not affect you much at this time. However, if you are a new prospective competitor looking to build a race car for SCCA club racing, or a seasoned regional racer giving advice to or *mentoring* such a *newbie*, it would be wise to be aware of these changes.

The next BOG meeting is coming up in a couple of weeks. There was discussion about some of the topics on the agenda. Governor Ron Offutt asked if there were any other suggestions of topics to take to the meeting. This BOG is at the beginning of our CFR fiscal year.

The next race event is **Drivers School/ Vintage/ TES enduro/ PDX at Sebring July 21&22.**

June was hot. July and August will be hotter and more miserable. A little bit of Gatorade type of drink is ok, but you need to consume 4 or 5 times that volume with just plain water! Just plain water is the best thing for hydrating your body during those extreme heat index days.

The amount CFR pays for use of the Daytona track is going up. Our working other events for them still keeps our rates lower than other clubs, but our track rental rates are still going up. Expect higher entry fees for Daytona events because of this in the coming season.

There was a lengthy discussion about our PDX program, last year it was a boon to our drivers school weekends and a natural fit. This year it is being expanded to include two other events, that are historically lower turnout weekends. There was discussion about such things as entry fee vs. track time; scheduling in the rotation of the groups, and how not to make the weekends schedule too unrealistically tight.

How much is it to get a sanctioning number (insure) the PDX vs. the same for normal race classes? Improving safety & rules compliance for PDX competitors, and over long term can we track how many PDX participants become club racing competitors?

PDX is popular and beneficial to our clubs covering its costs for events. Have a conversation within your own district and let your governor know your suggestions.

Governor Larry Joseph Morgan opened the meeting with a discussion concerning the upcoming BOG Meeting here in Davtona at the El Caribe Resort at 10 AM. Saturday. June 23rd, and the items on the agenda. This is a very crowded agenda, and El Caribe was kind enough to upgrade us to a larger room and also to extend our time, with no additional charges. The June BOG meeting is traditionally held at the site of the next Annual Meeting, which we will host in December. Lieutenant Governor Kauffman agreed to provide a scheme and artwork for the Annual Meeting. Attempts will be made to attract either Joey Chitwood from DIS, or Troy and/or Stan Flis from Spirit of Daytona Racing. Governor Morgan also discussed the need to make the Rally Cross program more viable and the need to make it more accessible to members who wish to participate. This is also a point of discussion at the next BOG Meeting.

Other items discussed based on input from members in attendance were:

A proposal for separate T-shirts for Daytona workers, partial reimbursement for "flat tow" personnel who use their own vehicles, and a system to prevent Enduro drivers from leaving pit lane prior to the completion of their mandatory pit stops as a result of "lessons learned" from the recent "Chump Car" event. Flag Ravings

JULY DRIVERS' SCHOOL AT SEBRING:

A Quick Review Phase 2 Students, please review your flag sheets, and to all Drivers both Rookie and Vet, never forget to take a guick look at every Flag Station on every lap. It's our only way of keeping you informed and safe.

To School Workers - our basic signals are covered in the class... Are you OK, flat tow, wrecker, engine running? Also signals to stay in or get out of the car and behind a barrier. Use them and hopefully you'll be understood.

For PDX Students, there is a flag sheet prepared for you ... it's abbreviated but should cover the flags you'll see during your PDX Experience. We enjoy having you with us and hope you'll consider extending your car quest career to join the Solo or Club Racing programs. To 'Share the Action,' you're always invited to observe or participate in the events as spectators or workers. You can get a good view of the inside action if vou want to join us on a Corner ... you're always welcome.

ADDITIONAL NOTE: For Students, their families, crews, and Instructors. Do not wear red, yellow or black track side you'll look like a moving flag and the students do not need any distractions!

VIEW FROM ON HIGH: From Dave Fredericks, a resident scanner expert, who works atop the Start Stand. Here's a list of our CFR radio frequencies and a 'how to' program your personal scanners. I'd suggest making a copy of this list and info to file in your track gear. That way you can give the info to new workers. And, for the times your scanner gets bumped and you suddenly end up stuck on the weather channel, this becomes your life line to the racing world!

6 channel radios

- 1)464.5250
- 2)464.9750
- 3)464.5250
- 4) 464.9750
- 5) 464.6750
- 6) 464.8250

To program your scanner, Select Bank 1, (channels 1 through 6 listed above) and program the rest of the channels contained in Bank 1 to zeros.

When scan is selected, have all the banks except 1 disabled.

Whichever channel the communicator has the club radio set to, often 5, then press 'manual 5 manual' on your scanner and engage the keyboard lock function. You stay on the main channel, plus your scanner uses less battery power when it is not in scanning mode. If you get bumped off of manual mode, by having all the banks turned off except bank 1, you will only be scanning the six frequencies you have programmed for listening to CFR.

You would begin to hear Tac 2 conversations, and intercom calls in some cases. Then you unlock the keyboard, go back to manual (channel) manual and keyboard lock again.

Questions? Ask Dave. (Hint) I carry the list of channel numbers and scanner info in my track gear handy if you suddenly discover you're locked into the weather channel when you bump your scanner.

HEALTH HINTS: Guard against dehydration. Don't be lulled into a false sense of security.

If it's broiling hot, you think of it, in cooler weather, it's easy to forget. Some of the worst weekends for people going down with dehydration were cloudy, cooler days - one medic told me they'd started more IV's on one day than they had in a week. Obviously consume lots of water, and, if using drinks like Gatorade, dilute them to half strength ... otherwise you

can do more harm than good. If you find yourself exhausted, weak, nauseated or just generally feeling lousy, call for Medical to check you out.

Better to check twice and find out you're OK than not to check and run into serious problems. Watch not only yourself, but also your fellow Workers. Most of us don't want to admit we're having a problem.

If someone is slowing down or becomes more quiet or less responsive, put in a call ... you'll both be glad you did.

And, early and often, slop on the sunscreen and remember to use it "year round". November through January can be some of the most important times because the angle of the sun is low, increasing the strength of UVA rays. Remember to check your sunscreen bottle... old sunscreen just doesn't work as

well - spring for a new bottle when needed.

This just in: In a recent visit to my Dermatologist, I saw information that said a sunscreen pill (RX) is being put on the market to protect you from sun burn and damage. In your next visit for a yearly skin check, (which, with my record, I highly recommend), you might want to check on it.

Also, Rit dye has a product for sun proofing your clothes called **Sun Guard**. Add it to the wash water. It's supposed to last for over 20 washing's and is available on the web.

Prevention sure beats the cure, or worse, I quarantee it!

Carroll Shelby: 1923-2012

Legendary auto racer and car builder **Caroll Shelby** passed away on May 10, 2012 at a hospital in Dallas, Texas.

Shelby is best known for the Shelby Cobra Roadster and Cobra Daytona coupe that he designed and built and which won the Shelby American team the GT World Championship in 1965. Old-time Central Florida Region members who attended or worked the Daytona and Sebring endurance races in the 1960's will remember the man and the legend he became.

His *cars achieved a 1-2-3 win at Daytona in 1965* and a *1-2 win in 1966* plus an overall win at Sebring in 1966 plus numerous first in class finishes there in the '60s.

His company, Shelby American Inc., that he founded in 1962 will carry on his name and legacy with modified Ford vehicles, as well as performance parts.
