# Daytona Double SARRC

The SARRC Series returned to Central Florida's Daytona International Speedway for the first time this year. With a Friday Test Day and two days of weekend racing, this would be the last opportunity to run the Daytona Road Course as the Runoffs quickly approach. Eight groups each had two races, a 20 minute Sprint and a 30 minute Main Event.

SCCA National will be enforcing sound control in September's Runoffs, which we typically don't worry about in our venues at Daytona and Sebring. However, CFR provided sound monitoring and reporting this weekend for those who are preparing to compete for a National Championship to give those teams time to adjust and tweak their exhausts.

The Friday test day saw about 150 cars take the track with CFR conducting the sessions. There were four sessions for each group running allowing for 75 minutes of track time per group.

Saturday began with 20 minute qualifying sessions for each of the eight groups. Racing began with the

Sprint Races for the first six groups after lunch and Sunday was packed with 10 races beginning with the final two Sprints and then eight 30 minute Main Events.

Group one had 29 winged entries scheduled to take the track after lunch on Saturday to begin the racing. Denver, Colorado's Tyler Hunter, perhaps just taking the opportunity to run Daytona in advance of the Runoffs as he waived the SARRC points, paced the group and established a new course record for Formula Atlantic of 1:49.212. Jim Downing of Atlanta also a waiver racer, finished second overall while setting a new record for Prototype 1 of 1:50.471.

The SARRC competitors: Donald Boughan drove the #57 Van Diemen RFoo to an FA win, William Falatick took the FB win, Carson Weeder drove to the FM win just ahead of FE winner, Thomas Green. John McTaggart took the Prototype 2 win finishing 2½ seconds in front of Chris Scharnow, who won the FC class.

### In Memoriam

### BILL MARTIN 1939 - 2015

Most of you know Bill from his activities with CFR and at Daytona and Sebring. However, there was a whole other person out there that I'd like to share with you.

First of all, he was a patriotic American, albeit a true Southern one. One of the things I loved about him from the very first was that he always teared up at the playing of The Star Spangled Banner.

A graduate of Auburn University, he held various offices in his fraternity, Delta Tau Delta, including that of President. At 6'4" and 250+ pounds he was big enough but not fast enough to play football... although he did manage to take out the entire sideline cheerleading contingent during one intramural game. As he said, he never met a line he couldn't get through – just couldn't do much once he got there. He loved college football and SEC football in particular. Just a month ago, he said he was 'ready for some football'.

<u>History Buff</u> - He never served in any branch of the military but had a great respect for all the men and women in the services. He thoroughly enjoyed articles and programs on the Civil War and WWI and WWII. Along those lines, he was also a respecter of firearms and the mechanical aspects of how they worked. Of course, he enjoyed both collecting and target practice with them.

<u>Music</u> - He couldn't carry a tune in a bucket but as he said, "I play a mean stereo". From Beethoven & Wagner to Al Hirt, Dire Straits, Flat & Scruggs, Frank Sinatra and everything in between....even a few operatic arias...he enjoyed them all.

The Space Program - He absolutely loved anything connected with the space program. Early on in his career, we lived in Huntsville, Alabama. Huntsville in the late 1960's was a pretty special place. With



Redstone Arsenal, Werner VonBraun and all of the associated space contractors gathered there, it was populated by a highly educated and highly paid group of young people. In fact, it was said that, at one time, Huntsville had the highest per capita number of Corvettes for a city of its size in the U.S. Bill's was a 1967 Nassau Blue air conditioned 427 stick shift convertible with white interior. He bought Good Year Blue Streaks for it and when we traded the car for a different vehicle 6 months later, we were still paying on those tires.

<u>Food</u> – Bill loved a good meal. Didn't have to be gourmet but my Mom's Fried Chicken, his Mom's Roast Leg of Lamb, fried shrimp from Chuck's or grouper fingers from Thudpuckers in Ft. Pierce would make him happy. Add a nice cold beer and/or a gin martini (shaken not stirred Thank You) and you made his day.



Outside the Ropes – Bill didn't always obey the rules if they didn't make sense to him and he didn't have much patience with illogical thinking. Swimming at a lake in Ocala, we were outside the rope boundary as the inside was filled with lots of children. We were chastised to return to the inside area by the life guard with an "All of you people, outside the ropes!! You need to get back inside!" Thus, anytime he chose to do something outside the norm, I could remind him with "You're outside the ropes, again." Not that it changed a thing.

<u>SCCA</u> – A 50 year member, Bill first became associated with sports car racing in north Alabama working crowd control on his Harley KK at the races in Courtland, Alabama. We worked a number of events as part of the Tennessee Valley Region before moving to Orlando around 1968.

CFR - Bill found a home with the Central Florida Region (CFR) starting in Technical Inspection. Things were much different then. CFR had no permanent race tracks and no money. In the 1980's John Bishop, President of IMSA, contacted Bill to find out if CFR would be interested in staffing pro-races (and getting paid) at Tampa, Miami, West Palm, St. Pete and, of course, Sebring and Daytona. Bill said 'Yes!' and the rest is history. By developing relationships with the powers that be at Sebring and Daytona, Bill was able to contract with them so that today, CFR continues to

enjoy and race at these two primary motorsports facilities.

He was always so very proud of that accomplishment and what it meant to CFR as well as the sports car racing community as a whole. He truly loved this club. He served in many positions within CFR and his most recent honor was as recipient of the Bill Cannons Lifetime Achievement Award – 2013.

Animals – Bill grew up on 40 acres in N. Alabama where his folks raised Tennessee Walking Horses and he had just about every kind of dog (purebred Collie, Dachshund, Boston Bulldog, Cocker Spaniel, Great Dane, etc.) as pets. When we married, we both wanted a pet but with our work and hobby schedule, a dog wasn't really an option. Enter the cats! Over the years, we've had ten 4 legged children who allowed us to live with them. He loved them all. He had pictures of Cosmo and Clancy (the latest two) in his wallet and was quick to share those photos of his fur babies with everyone.

<u>Toys</u> - Writing about Bill wouldn't be complete without commenting on his love of 'toys'. Always the first one with a new gadget (some worked well, some not so well) he was the consummate lover of new things. I'm pretty sure he was the poster child for the bumper sticker "He who dies with the most toys, wins!"

Writing this piece made me realize how very special Bill was. There was nothing devious about him. What you saw was what you got. If you asked him a question, you'd better be ready for an honest opinion. In any discussion you always knew how he felt. He was true to his beliefs and a loval friend.

We were certainly not joined at the hip, but many of our activities were as a couple. I will miss that

camaraderie and sharing of mutual interests. After 48 years, it's strange to think of planning activities without his input.

At his request, there were no services but I can promise you we will have a CELEBRATION! at a later date and share many more "Martin" stories. Please make any contributions in his memory to Hospice of the Comforter, Altamonte Springs, FL or to your favorite charity.

The group 2 cars contained the "wingless" open wheelers and had 13 cars take the green flag. Dade City's John Benson would pace all with a nearly 30 second margin of victory but no trophy as a "waiver driver." Jason Generotti of Plantation, Florida would take home the FF SARRC trophy in the #13 Swift DB-1. Other SARRC winners were Richard Klotz in CF and C. Fred Clark in the #87 Caracal D in the FV class.

The third group was filled with Spec Racer Fords. 41 cars in both the SRF and SRF3 classes would take the green and would provide some of the tightest racing especially since some of the time was consumed in clearing an incident allowing just six laps to be completed in the 20 minute race window. The top eight cars finished within three seconds of each other. Kerry Jacobsen in the #38 SRF3 finished second overall to waiver driver Bobby Sak by a tenth of a second but took the SARRC win by .123 seconds over Todd Vanacore in the #19. Denny Stipling of McKinney, Texas paced the 17 SRF drivers for the win finishing 3½ seconds over Neil Tilbor who took second.

Group 4 brought 34 cars in a myriad of classes including the Touring, Improved Touring B and C, Super Touring and B-Spec classes. Ian Mullen would

pace the field winning the STU class driving the #155 BMW E36 finishing ahead of STL winner, Mike Van Steenburg in the #94 Mazda RX7 who established a new track record of 2:14.683 for STL.

Ed Barr drove the #57 Subaru BRZ to a T4 win, Gerald Wilcox in the #144 VW GTI took the ITB win and Orlando's Darren Seltzer took the B-Spec win in the #64 Honda Fit by half a second over Chi Ho in the #07 Honda Fit. Miki Moerwald used all four cylinders in the #47 VW Rabbit this weekend to take the ITC win over Robert Duffy in the #04 Honda Civic by a 1.564 second margin of victory.

The fifth Sprint Race brought 19 cars mostly in the Production class. Jeffrey Cripe drove the #196 BMW E<sub>3</sub>6 to an EP win finishing second overall to waiver driver, Tim Kezman who paced all in the #44 Porsche 997 setting a new track record for T2 of 2:06.610; Oscar Hernandez would take the SARRC T2 win. District 9 Governor, Charlie Leonard, drove the #14 Nissan 200SX to the best GTL finish but as a waiver driver, no trophy. Wayne Butler took the SARRC GTL win in the #30 Mazda Miata over Mickey Thompson.

The final race on Saturday saw 54 Spec Miatas take the green flag. The top four would finish within a second of each other and Cory Collum in the #23 would pace all drivers for the win finishing .059 seconds in front of waiver driver, Jonathan Goring. Selin M. Rollan finished third overall, second place trophy .26 seconds behind Goring.

Sunday morning began with... fog. Yep, in mid August. The delay was minimal and the racing began just about 30 minutes behind schedule bringing the big bore cars to the stripe. Twenty-six cars took green and Bill Riddell in the one of a kind #15 Ford Falcon paced all drivers with over an eight second margin of victory and a GTI win. Randy Kinsland of Whittier, NC drove the #4 Corvette to the GT2 win, second

overall to Riddell, and set a new GT2 track record of 1:54.138. Cameron Maugeri in the #06 Ford Mustang took fifth overall, set a new track record of 1:58.658 and a Ti win finishing ahead of SPO winner, Harry Hinkle in the #128 Dodge Charger. Kimberlee Hendricks drove the #26 Ford Mustang GT to an ITO win and Jack Dunn drove the #3 Shelby Can Am to the ASR win finishing just behind AS winner, Jerry Post of Sunset. South Carolina.

The next race would be the last Sprint race and brought 36 Improved Touring class cars to take the green flag. Richard Gallup drove the #101 Mazda RX7 to over a 20 second overall win and an ITS victory

over waiver driver, Dale Lagasse in the #100 ITR Ford Mustang. Barry Burgoon drove the #71 Mazda Miata to third overall and an ITA win over Robin Langlotz in the #9 Acura Integra. Linden Parchment drove the #136 BMW 325I to the SARRC ITR win ahead of Rusty Varnadoe in the #23 BMW 328Is. David Moye in the #3 Mazda RX7 would take the IT7 victory over Jermaine Walters in the #180 Mazda RX7.

The Main Events - 30 minute races kicked off about an hour late due to the fog. Group 1 had six who did not show for the start leaving 23 cars to take the green flag. The top two in the group finished as on Saturday with waiver driver Tyler Hunter taking first overall ahead of Jim Downing, who shaved over a quarter second off the track record he set on Saturday on his way to a P1 win. Kevin Roggenbuck finished third overall while establishing a new track record of 1:53.382 for FB. Thomas Green, John McTaggart and Chris Scharnow each recorded their second wins of the weekend in FE, P2, and FC respectively finishing 7th, 8th and 9th overall.

Group 2 returned to the track bringing back the whole field from Saturday's Sprint race. John Benson would again pace the field to over a 41 second margin of victory. Donald Baggett driving the #75 Swift DB-6 would improve from his third place finish Saturday to win the FF class on Sunday by .048 seconds over Saturday's winner, Jason Generotti. Richard Klotz and C. Fred Clark would again win their classes, CF and FV.

Group 3 saw 40 SRF racers take the green. Todd Vanacore improved from his third overall finish on Saturday to nose past Kerry Jacobsen for first overall and the SRF3 win on Sunday by a .145 second margin.

Denny Stripling couldn't hold off David Donovan at the end who edged Stripling by .016 seconds for the SRF win in the #77.

Group 4 saw all 34 drivers return to take the green flag. Ian Mullen again paced all with another STU win by a very comfortable 1:42 margin. Jake Warner made the most of his time between races as he improved from a 7th in class in Saturday's sprint to an STL win and third overall. Ed Barr would again take the T4 win, Michael Horn would improve from third on Saturday to take the ITB win on Sunday in the #10 Ford Mustang. Mike Moerwald took a second ITC win by a .206 margin over Robert Duffy while Darren Seltzer notched his second B-Spec win by a much tighter .025 seconds over Chi Ho.

Group 5 returned bringing all but one of Saturday's drivers to the grid. The top seven in this race were all waiver drivers led again by Tim Kezman with slightly over 30 seconds to the runner-up. Don Loftis recorded his first win in the #6 HP Honda CRX which was driven to the HP win on Saturday by W. Griffin. T2 driver Oscar Hernandez recorded his second victory of the weekend as did Wayne Butler in GTL. Miata Mania saw 51 competitors return for the Main Event. After 13 laps, the top six cars finished within 1½ seconds of the lead. Cory Collum would finish .015 seconds ahead of Alex Bolanos in the #69 for his second win of the weekend. Todd Lamb in the #84 improved from fifth overall Saturday to third overall Sunday by less than a quarter second for his second third place finish in a very competitive group.

Group 7 saw the return of the Big Bores... 23 of the 26 who kicked off Sunday's races returned. Randy Kinsland notched his second GT2 win and took first overall - Bill Riddell, first overall in the morning race, did not show for the start of this race. That left the door open for Michael Seay who drove the #10 Chevrolet Camaro to a GT1 win, third overall. Collins Barber in the #55 Camaro improved from his second place finish in the Sprint to win AS in the Main Event. All other class winners from the Sprint, Maugeri in T1, Hinkle in SPO, Dunn in ASR, Hendricks in ITO and Bacon in GT3 would notch their second wins in class.

The final group took the track on 17 minutes behind the scheduled start time and saw all but one return from the morning session. Dale Lagasse, waiver driver in ITR would improve from the morning of second overall to edge Rusty Varnadoe by .124 seconds. Varnadoe made some nice adjustments as he improved from 13th overall to finish second overall in the #23 BMW 328Is and take the ITR win. Richard

Gallup, overall winner in the Sprint finished third in the Main Event but first in ITS. Barry Burgoon dropped six spots overall from the morning, but notched his second ITA win edging Langlotz by just over a second after 12 laps of racing. David Moye would record his second IT7 win of the day/weekend.

### From The Flamingo's Beak

While hanging out at Club Flamingo, the discussion turned to teaching drivers the dos and don'ts of being towed. While some seemed common sense others, while having actually happened, prompted this discussion.

We all make mistakes. Yes, we screw up too. We strive to make the tow as safe as possible and ask that you would help us to achieve this as well.

We ask the following for your safety and ours:

- Please evaluate your tow points.
- Are they properly marked?
- Do they meet GCR standards for your car?

Are you willing to accept the risk of being trapped in your car in a tire wall with tires all around you and a fire breaks out and we cannot pull the car out to get to you? Are you willing to bet your life on a cheap tow point?

When was the last time you checked the condition of

the nylon strapping used as a tow point? Is it sun damaged? Weather rotted? Dog chain is really not a good idea either.

Are you using thick zip ties that require cutting to get it free? Use ones we can break by pulling the strap and they release. We want to limit the time on a hot track; the longer time having to cut ties places you and us in a bad position.

Is the tow point under the car and not visible? Laying on a hot track to find it is extremely dangerous.

We want to get you off track as fast and safely as possible with minimal time spent unprotected. Both your safety and ours depends on it. While on a hot track expect to exit at the nearest safe opening going race direction.

If on a cold track we will try to take you off to avoid pulling you through rough and dirty terrain, but we are controlled by the tower - they control our movement.

While in tow, ride the brakes a little and keep the

strap tight, not guitar string tight, but don't let it slack or drag. We'll signal, when possible, upcoming turns and stops. Using your brakes keeps the strap tight and prevents unnecessary jerking on our trucks and your racecar when accelerating. Please do not run over the strap. It damages the strap and the tow hook also has the potential to damage your car.

Please tell us **before we start the tow** if you have no brakes so we can arrange a wrecker to take you back safely to your paddock.

**Yes**, you must wear your helmet, gloves, and have seat restraints on. While in tow, you're still sitting in a racecar with many other racecars as well as others driving around in the paddock who may not be aware of a vehicle in tow... safety is always the primary consideration when these pesky rules are put in place.

**Yes**, you must be in the car during a flat tow, Our straps are 30 feet long, if you are not seated behind the steering wheel, at approximately 35 feet, things are going to get real exciting.

**No**, you cannot bump start while under tow, that is for our truck's and your safety. The strap is thirty feet long depending on where your tow point is. The distance could be shorter which makes the possibility of you meeting the bumper of the truck highly likely.

We ask you to keep to the left so we can see you in our side mirror and use hand signals to communicate with you. We want to see your smiling face in our driver's side mirror; you should see ours as well. If we cannot see you we will assume you no longer wanted to be towed.

Where we go you must follow. Sometimes we may be directed to take you to tech or a different way. Pay attention to others who are not and may drive or walk between the vehicles while in paddock or on pit lane.

**Know** where you got in the race car. That should be the same place you and your car would like to return. Guided tours of the paddock can be arranged by appointment and for a fee of fifty dollars. ©

**Yes**, we will take you to your paddock but, "I am in the white trailer or next to the white trailer..." Well think about it, how many white trailers are in the paddock. Same goes for next to the restrooms.

**Yes**, we understand you are upset that your car was disabled and or wrecked, but we didn't do it. Remember we are workers like everyone else.

Smile for the camera. You just may make the FTM FB page for "Tow" of the event.

Let's all be safe out there and remember, "Keep it Tight!"


