

RE Report

Another busy month for CFR, earlier in the year I had written that we would do 100 event days in 2008, little did I realize that meant almost every weekend.

Be sure to make your calendars, Nov 15th is the date for the next CFR Tire Rack Street Survival School at the Geneva Solo site.

This school is for drivers 16 to 21 and covers car control in the participant's vehicle. For more Info check with Art Trier.

In September, in addition to the regular solo and club race events the CFR BoG held its 3rd quarter meeting in Orlando on the 14th.

There was much to discuss, so, I'll just give you the brief highlights version.

Sebring 2009 January National; we tried to get this to be a double, unfortunately the dates prior and post were already taken. We are in line to have a double in 2010.

Daytona 24 hour 2009; expect that there will be NO infield parking passes, the track plans to have competitors, workers and vendors park outside of Nascar 4 and run continuous shuttles with one of the stops will be at the gate where we normally have

the CFR compound. In light of this information we plan on having more CFR shuttles and carts on hand.

In late August, Bill Martin and I were requested to attend a meeting at the speedway with Bill's track contact, her boss and her bosses' boss. We did not turn the invitation down.

The discussion started with 'would we be agreeable to moving the September date'? Our answer was "sure", additionally, since we were making changes, we suggested test days at the May and August race dates. They said "what a great idea", and have planned on sending operational staff members down to the Sebring Test day in January to see what it takes to actually do a test day for club. The test days are not a done deal, but are in the works for 2009. The September race date for 2009 is firm; in 2010 it could be moved.

Next, we discussed how hard it was to have our registration at the current location, bullet proof windows and small openings for doing all the required paperwork. We offered to change the windows and when on to mention the CFR building at Sebring. We discussed how that Sebring deal was set-up and then...

They asked if we'd be interested in having a building on Daytona Speedway property? And then... we started looking at the map for a location. However, this is very far from being a deal, but has a serious chance of happening, as the Honda Pavilion, out front of the speedway, has set the precedent.

Since this meeting with the speedway was going so well, I thought I'd throw out one more item and see how it was received. So, we discussed that the 2012 SCCA National Championship races would be up for bid after 3 years at Road America, and would Daytona be interested. Not only was the answer yes, they had also expressed interest in the bid that went out last year. This discussion point is far from being any more than just that, but I thought you'd be interested.

Back to the CFR BoG meeting; the Board voted 5 to 4 that they were changing the Daytona 2009 May Race weekend from a Restricted Regional event to a National/ECR as we have had in the recent past.

As always, keep those cards and letters coming.

District 1

The September District 1 meeting, held on September 9, saw well-over 30 members and guests join us at 'Joe's Crab Shack' in Clearwater. District Governor Sammi Ronshausen provided us with an update on a variety of CFR issues, and reported on the efforts of the volunteer crew who spent their Labor Day Monday making improvements to our Sebring Compound following the full-course Regional there over the August 30-31 Weekend.

Chief among accomplishments at the compound was expansion of the electrical service, which added another 20 outlets, and will enable the Club to better-

accommodate peak demand periods.

Sammi mentioned that the Club has requested that camping vehicles be removed during non-event periods. A primary motivator is difficulty cited by Sebring maintenance personnel in mowing the grass in and around our compound with vehicles present. Rich Kasson helpfully suggested that he would be willing to employ a weed whacker to address this concern, while others wondered if a small flock of sheep might be an acceptable solution, notwithstanding the obvious complications arising from the introduction of barnyard animals to the

compound. It was cited that potential sales of wool could result in revenue enhancement to offset operating expenses. Further study is needed, but in the meantime, we were reminded to restrict overnight parking to races. Sincere thanks were extended to those who gave up their holiday to benefit CFR by making the needed improvements.

A review of items anticipated to come before the Board of Governors at their next (Sept. 14) meeting included a discussion of worker awards for our 50th anniversary year and plans to review entry fees in light of rising expenses.

Gloria's fine work in getting the program underway over the past two years was noted with appreciation by all. In a brief statement. Gail noted the need for the Club to closely monitor expenses while providing the broadest range of services possible to those who donate their efforts to our success. With this in mind, Gail indicated that she will make recommendations to the BoG to maintain expense offsets to

workers, while strictly controlling costs in recognition of the difficult economic climate which presently confronts us.

Berta Sager, visiting from District 6 (Sebring area), reminded everyone to register for the upcoming Annual Meeting to be held at the Quality Inn-Sebring. Organizers are promising a very special event for our 50th year. Details are available in the Checker.

The meeting concluded with our traditional award of door prizes, with Gail Kasson the lucky recipient of a new car, the most highly sought prize every month in District One.

In Memoriam

Monday, September 15, 2008 It is with a heavy heart I must convey that my father, Joseph Pendergast, passed away on Sunday, September 14, 2008 at 12:45 PM at 69 years of age. Joe succumbed to complications from pneumonia, which he was originally diagnosed with on May 9, 2008. He was recovering and in decent condition until Friday, September 5, when he was admitted to the hospital with breathing difficulties. On Sunday,

September 7th, he was moved from a regular room into CCU (Cardiac Care Unit) for better monitoring. Over the following week, he had increasing difficulty with breathing, which was exacerbated by the pneumonia, which had spread into both lungs. Joe passed peacefully surrounded by his family. Joe is succeeded by his wife of 45 years, Carol, daughter Michele and son Tim, and beloved grandchildren Joshua, Megan and Alexis.

Joe was owner and general manager of West Coast Caterers, an airline caterer, until it was sold to Dobbs House in 1973. At that point, he returned to college at the University of South Florida, where he graduated in 1976 with a BA in Finance. After graduating from USF, he attended and graduated from the University of Miami School of Law with the degree of Juris Doctor.

Joe's involvement in racing began when

he attended the NASCAR Grand National Race in Daytona Beach in 1958 (the last race on the beach). In the same year, he also attended his first Sebring 12 Hours, which would become his favorite race track. His enthusiasm of the sport grew and included amateur drag racing and gokart racing. In the early 70's, after selling West Coast Caterers, he began collecting and restoring vintage cars. Joe's collection of cars through the years included a: Porsche 906 (2), Porsche 908, Porsche Speedster, Elva Porsche, Cunningham C-2R, Allard J-2X, Lister Chevrolet, Ferrari 212 Barchetta, Ferrari

250 MM, Ferrari Daytona, Ferrari 275 GTB/4, Jaguar SS100, which all began with a 1929 Packard Roadster, amongst others. Joe restored many of these cars, as well as racing them at vintage events across the US.

His involvement in vintage racing progressed from competing in vintage races to becoming General Manager and Competition Director of SVRA in 1985. Joe was a Partner, General Manager and Competition Director of HSR from it's inception in 1991, building it from 5 small events in 1991 to 9 very successful events in 2002. Joe's only regret prior to passing

was not being able return to his role as Competition Director of HSR.

Joe is being cremated. He asked his ashes be spread at his three favorite race tracks: Sebring, Watkins Glen and Laguna Seca. There will be a "Celebration of Joe's Life" on Saturday, September 27, 2008 at 4 PM, in Tampa, FL. The Tire Rack Street Survival School

CFR is again hosting an accident avoidance school sponsored by the Tire Rack and SCCA for young folks who have recently received their permit/ license or for older kids with some road experience that want to learn how their car reacts to driver input when avoiding a hazardous road situation.

The Tire Rack Street Survival School course is a national program that goes well beyond what is taught in a typical high school Driver Ed class. The school involves both classroom and one-on-one hands-on field instruction. The students use the car that they would normally drive on the street, whether that is the family LTD, a PT Cruiser or a Honda Civic. Parents are encouraged to attend.

Each year, too many of our kids are killed and injured in auto accidents across the nation. The typical Drivers Ed course does not teach hands-on accident avoidance and therefore kids have no idea how their car will react to emergency inputs. Our school gives them that experience in a safe and controlled environment.

The school is open to 16-21 year olds including former students from earlier schools. They may participate again if they so wish and some kids have entered in as many as four schools to continue to gain experience. However, the point is that this school is for every kid. It is not necessary to be an SCCA member. And, if they are not a member, along with the other goodies they will receive, their entry fee entitles them to a 1-year's membership in the club.

For those interested, registration for this school and all other schools is done online at the Street Survival's website (see below) and payment of the entry fee (\$60) is done by credit card.

Our school, scheduled for November 15 at the Seminole County Police Training facility in Geneva, is fast approaching. As with the prior school we ran in April, we will hold the line at a maximum of 30 students but we still have many slots open. If you know of a teenager who can benefit from this school, or a parent of one who would like their child to learn accident avoidance techniques while driving their street car, visit www.streetsurvival.org for further information and registration.

We are just about up to the desired levels of Instructor /Coaches for the event but we still need about 6-8 additional staff members to oversee the exercises. Any volunteers?

FROM THE BOG CHAIR.....Recap of 3rd Quarter BOG Meeting

Districts/Governors

The CFR BOG met in Orlando on Sunday, September 14. All Districts were represented. Governor District 8, Ron Camacho, resigned and Lt. Governor John Woessner was approved to serve the remainder of the term. Governor Lyn Watts (D-4) notified the board that she does not intend to stand for re-election. Governors from even numbered districts (2,4,6,8) are up for election this year. Nominations are due to the Secretary, Carol Gaveletz, by October 14 and ballots will be sent October 29th.

Competition/Race/Solo

CFR continues to maintain good relations with our tracks - Daytona International Speedway and Sebring International Raceway. We are working to ease the parking and access issues at DIS and will have pre-event meetings with DIS fire and security to identify and address areas of concern. Other items for future consideration at Daytona are overnight camping (for a fee) and test days prior to our larger events.

At Sebring, we will develop a reasonable proposal to extend our current building lease which expires in 8 years. Any agreement requires approval by the Airport Authority. We tried to reserve days in January 2009 for a double national;

however they weren't available. We are working towards a double national in January 2010. Work has been done in our campground compound to repair electric and water connections. Sebring is building some new corner stations and we will provide a monetary contribution to assist.

St.Pete Grand Prix

We are working to identify and secure a location near Tropicana Field to serve our needs to avoid the space and logistics issues from past years.

Our RE continues to communicate on behalf of CFR as a Jumbo Region with our National Executives to address our needs which are unique as a larger entity.

Conversations include insurance, scheduling and national/regional race programs.

Our RBC noted that CFR continues to race more cars and provide more seat time for our drivers than any other Region in SEDIV. Like all of the Regions, we have seen some reduction in entries. We provide perks to our workers in the form of gas cards and lunches. The July Drivers School/Vintage Race will be continued for next year. Look for the Vintage rules on our web site.

From Solo, there are 4 active venues with a 5th available if needed. The new facility at Geneva works well. The Palm Bay event had 70 entries but Brooksville events typically have entries in the teens. CFR will support the Tire Rack Street Survival event again this year. It will be held November 15th at the Geneva site.

The Board received presentations from Lee Hill/John Annis recommending a reversal of the decision to change the 2009 May Daytona event to a Regional/ECR. We also received comments from Jim Cohen, Mark Dana and Menas Akajarlian supporting the Regional/ECR format. In New Business, the Board voted 5 to 4 to keep the Daytona May Event a National for 2009.

From a Financial standpoint - our Treasurer reported that our annual audit is underway. Our Financial Manager reported that although our account has lost some value, we have outperformed the big averages YTD and for the last 12 months.

The Board thanked Jack Ragaglia for his efforts in getting our new web site (CFRSCCA.org) up and working.

The Governors were reminded that it is time for nominations for the Distinguished Service Award and Worker of the Year Awards for Administration, Race and Solo. District 6 - Chuck Dawson - is hosting our Annual Meeting this year in Sebring. It is our 50th Anniversary. Tim Stoddard will speak Saturday at the worker lunch and Dorsey Schroeder will be our keynote speaker Saturday evening.

Our next meeting will be Sunday, December 14th at Sebring.

In the early 90's I was asked to serve on the National Road Rally Board, which I did for 8 years. The last 4 were spent as the Chairman. Currently, I am the SEDIV Rally Steward. I have also been active in developing the Rally Cross program which has replaced Pro Rally.....think Solo II conducted in a field on an ever changing surface. Having been involved at the National and Divisional level I'm well aware of how things get done or not done within SCCA. This experience has given me the insight that is necessary, if someone is to be instrumental in implementing new changes, in the rules and policies of the Club.

Our greatest need for change comes with regard to Club Racing. Club Racing ... both National and Regional ... is the backbone of the SCCA. It is the very reason this organization was founded. Club Racing, and those who participate in it as drivers and volunteers, are what pays the lion's share of the bills of the SCCA. In order to preserve and expand Club Racing we must modify the rule making process. The BOD needs to get out of the "rule making business". We have a CRB that should capable of making Club road racing rules without BOD meddling. Active

drivers should have more input into proposed changes. They should have the opportunity to be heard during a rules change "window" before any changes are implemented. The CRB should hand down a set of guidelines to the Ad Hoc committees and advisory groups for their input on proposed changes. A staff of Tech and other advisors should be able to research areas in question, and provide the necessary advice to the Ad Hoc committees and advisory groups so that they can make intelligent decisions and recommendations to the CRB. Once consensus has been achieved, the recommended proposal should be presented by the CRB to the BOD for approval. Leave the rules alone for at least 3 years so that someone can prepare a car and not worry that next year they may have to start all over with a new rules set.

The Area 3 Director along with the Area 12 Director, share the responsibility for SEDIV policy and the representation of SEDIV members at SCCA National. In order to be an effective voice on the BOD, the Directors should have similar positions on important issues. I have spoken with Phil Creighton and we share many of the same concerns for the Club and SEDIV. I

feel we can work together to make necessary changes that many of you have expressed a desire to see occur. Although I am not a Driver, I do attend and work all of the FL. Many participants, hot racing in every sense of the word, and a great way to spend the Labor Day Weekend. Congratulations to all participants.... and of course, appreciation to all the Workers.

AGAIN THANKS CFR FAMILY: Brevard had the distinction of being all over the national TV news networks during Tropical Storm Fay. She was no lady, just an unwanted guest who didn't have the sense to leave. She sat on us for days and when she did move, albeit slowly, she shared the wealth with the rest of the state in her progress - we were all swamped for the better part of a week. We were among the lucky ones, although the surrounding roads were rivers, our house was never threatened. And, we never lost power, which was a first for any storm. During the 'week that never should have been,' we got many calls from all of you, checking up on us and offering help if needed. We really appreciate your being there for us and each other.

AHB'S NO HONEYS: Some time ago, I wrote about a new breed of killer bees establishing themselves in Florida. At the time, they were reported as being spotted in Sebring. These bees are very aggressive, attacking in swarms whenever they feel they are threatened. They have now been spotted in our area in Melbourne in Brevard County. People are advised to run very fast (motivation is the key) in a straight line for as long as you can and seek shelter. Even jumping in a lake is no remedy...they can hover to attack much longer than you can hold your breath.

I would encourage anyone allergic to bee stings to check with your doctor to see if he or she recommends you carry and Epi pen. Anaphylactic shock can be deadly - it can develop suddenly and you need to have a remedy close at hand. The pens are small and easy to use.

I'd also encourage you to let your Corner Captain or a corner buddy know where you keep the pen, and how to use if necessary for you to assist. It's a case of better safe than sorry. This also holds true for any medical problems you might have. If you need help, it will get you the response you need much more quickly and help our medical team to help too.

ROEBLING RUNOFFS: As always, many CFR and FL drivers participated in the Southeastern Regional championship races at Roebling. Any workers who haven't yet sent in their gas, lodging and food receipts should do so promptly. Thanks to the SEDiv, workers receive compensation for their participation. More on the races next month.

DLB REGISTRATION: to receive a gas card for CFR events, be sure to register online. This is a worker perk that is much appreciated by all of us. Ted's Technology, Trivia & Tidbits

Technology and Business:

Light trucks accounted for 58.4% of light-vehicle output in August 2007, this August's tally is will probably plunge more than 12 percentage points to 46.1%.

Through June, Honda's sales rose 4.1%, compared with the first six months of 2007. They `Have it Right'. Honda's manufacturing prowess primarily is attributable to commonalities in vehicle architectures. The auto maker's plant in Alliston, ON, Canada, can accommodate all-wheel-drive Honda Ridgeline unibody pickups and Acura MDX CUVs on the same assembly line as a front-wheel-drive Civic. They can literally build one right after the other of the different models. This enables Honda to exploit peak demand for hot-selling models by juggling excess capacity reserved for slow movers. The auto maker did just that in March when it shuffled some Civic production to Alliston from its assembly plant in East Liberty, OH. This created more capacity in East Liberty for production of the CR-V compact CUV, while moving the Ridgeline to Honda's plant in Lincoln, AL, where there was excess capacity.

Last year, the CR-V was the best-selling utility vehicle in the U.S. And through June, despite a down market, deliveries were flat vs. first-half 2007. Model changeover is another key facet of flexibility. At Honda, it's immediate. They can build a new model right behind an old model. You might have one or two empty spaces, but that's it. American Honda expects its 2008 sales to reach a record 1.59 million units. Honda's total U.S. sales are up 4.1% this year, while the overall industry is down 10.1%. Honda is opening a new 4-cyl. engine plant in Alliston, ON, Canada, later this year. Honda also is gearing up to open a new vehicle plant in Greensburg, IN, in September, which solely will build Civics.

Nissan Motor Co. Ltd. CEO Carlos Ghosn announced a new electric car initiative with the state of Tennessee during the dedication of the auto maker's new \$100 million headquarters in Franklin, TN.

Ghosn says Nissan and the state are

partnering to promote zero-emission vehicles, including pure-electric vehicles, with participation from the Tennessee Valley Authority and other partners.

GM will reduce by 300,000 units its truck and related stamping and engine capacity by the end of 2009. Half of these reductions represent an acceleration of previously announced actions.

Mazda5 sales surged 44.1% for the year's first six months to 11,977 units, compared with like-2007, helped along by U.S. buyers downsizing their vehicles in the face of gasoline prices surpassing \$4 a gallon. The similarly proportioned Kia Rondo is finding success in the U.S. Its sales are up 60% so far this year

Chevron Corporation announced that it is dropping its Texaco NASCAR sponsorship at the end of the year, bringing to an end a relationship that has endured for 20 years. The announcement means that Chip Ganassi need to find a new backer for Montoya. This may be a problem as he recently has to shut down one of his crews because money could not be found despite the team running Dario Franchitti.

Trivia:

The LS9 Corvette engine has one skilled technician building each engine up from the finished aluminum block to the installation of its heavy-duty flywheel and twin-plate clutch. Total build time takes nearly five hours, with LS9 output set at 45 engines per week.

There are 25 engine assemblers (38 total employees), with three lead builders training the staff. More than 2,000 hours have been spent familiarizing workers with the intricacies of the LS9.

The seat fabric in the '08 Ford Escape Hybrid is made of 100% pre-consumer recycled content, such as pop bottles that were discarded because they didn't meet the manufacturer's specifications. Nissan Motor Co. Ltd. presently is "studying" using this fabric in its upcoming electric vehicle, due in 2010.

Poker has enjoyed a boom in recent years with the televising of the game and its

influence has managed to achieve something which Formula 1 has struggled to do for years - it has got the drivers socializing at races. There is not much time in modern Formula 1 but in recent months a group of drivers including Fernando Alonso, Robert Kubica, Rubens Barrichello, Giancarlo Fisichella, Adrian Sutil and Tonio Liuzzi have taken to playing poker some evenings in the quiet of the upper floors of the Force India motorhome.

Inveterate gamblers like Bernie Ecclestone, Flavio Briatore and Michael Schumacher have also joined in, but the drivers do not seem keen to turn the event into a spectacle and are happy to enjoy the simple pleasure of a card game, something which has not been seen in F1 since the days when Alain Prost and Jacques Laffite used to while away the hours playing cards in the 1980s.

Crystal Ball:

2008 - The Routan minivan from the contract-assembly deal VW has with Chrysler LLC. Routan production is set to begin this fall at Chrysler's minivan plant in Windsor, ON, Canada.

2009 - The next-generation Chevy Equinox cross/utility vehicle will come to market in May, 2009 with a new, more fuel-efficient 4-cyl. engine.

2009 - 315 dealers have signed on to sell diesel-powered trucks, Mahindra & Mahindra's first U.S. offerings. The vehicles will come from the new plant, which is being built south of Mumbai. It is a "high likelihood" they will arrive as knocked-down kits. That would enable the truck maker to get around a 25% tax imposed on pickuptruck imports.

2011 - VW Production at Chattanooga is scheduled to begin with initial annual capacity set at 150,000 units.

Turning the Corner

I have more than a few things to comment about this month. Some items are a continuation from last month's column, others are new. One predominate topic that I will continue to harp upon is "Better Communications". I hope that you believe, as I do, that good communications and accurate, timely information is required to run any successful organization. All decisions are made upon information that is at hand, if the data is incorrect, then most likely the decision made will be flawed at best. I have more than a few comments on that subject. Closer to the real purpose of this column are the results of the points races towards the Championships. Also the Area 3 BOD election and some comments on the Annual Meeting. Also I want to add my two cents worth in the lack of Area 3's representation on the ITAC. Plus a visit to an old F1 street course in France. So here I go again.

Better Communications

Item 1. As I told you last month, I would contact our Area 3 Director, K.P Jones regarding why there is not an "Official" SCCA website that would permit the BOD, CRB, and ITAC committees to better respond to the membership regarding their various activities and were the membership could likewise also respond. This web site should be available to the general membership. Does not the CRB or BOD feel that it would be beneficial? I sent E-mail to K.P. and here is his response:

Hi David. There are already a number of forums available to the members on the SCCA website. I believe it is possible to discuss anything SCCA-related with likeminded folks.

I am not in favor of having the BoD respond to websites. The Directors often either are in disagreement on certain issues, or simply haven't considered the issue as a group. Selecting a spokesperson for the BoD would be fraught with danger.

And personally, I will not respond to website material. The risk of either being villified or getting drawn into a never-ending word battle (or both) is far too great. And the chance of simply stating your position & having folks

either agree or disagree with your position has become very rare on most sites.

When members wish to find out what the Bod is thinking (assuming we are thinking), the best way is to contact one's Director. A timely response should be forthcoming.

We often receive material directed to "the BoD" (usually as a copy of something to a member board such as the CRB). These inquiries often go unanswered bcs (because) none of the Directors recognizes the inquirer as a member of that Director's Area.

The CRB logs in every inquiry & tries to respond to all, after due consideration. Still, I don't believe a forum would work for them, either.

I must admit, early in the history of the Internet, I believed it would be an excellent way to exchange views. Not any more. K P

This is not the kind of answer I had hoped for. I did not follow-up with PK to ask him why does not feel that the Internet is a "good way" to exchange views. Or maybe he has found out that we have just become "cynical" and disrespectful of opinions other than our own, to just say "we will have to agree to disagree" and end the debate? Does the entire BOD feel the same way? What do you think? K.P is not running for re-election for Area 3 Director, so hopefully our new Area 3 Director will think otherwise.

Item 2. I discussed last month the "Letter from the RE" that announced that "The 'race worker perk' is now the single biggest budget line item at \$140,000, exceeding the insurance expense of \$130,000, and facility rental of \$120,000." I also commented on the dollars spent and who I thought be should be entitled to the perks. I have now received an e-mail that may suggest that the \$140K numbers maybe somewhat misleading. The e-mail was from one of our many "value added" workers and they informed me that there maybe many "Non-Perk" items included in the "Race Worker Perks" number. And those items would to "inflate" the dollar figure. If this is correct, then it is not the race workers perks that are major cost item but costs associated

with running our region's race program. I may have no issues with any of those items. But don't take me for a fool by telling me something that is not accurate and misleading.

It is being suggested that Equipment Maintenance for our vehicles, radios, and etc. maybe included in the \$140K number. I'm not an bean counter but there is no way "Equipment Maintenance" should be included in "RWP's". The cost of the "Workers" school. which has been largely funded by the region's competitors, maybe in that number too. Again, I think that this is a stretch at best that training should be in that number either. While necessary and valuable to our race programs success, and a very legitimate cost. I think it would be a hard sell to tell the workers that this is a "Perk". I could be wrong. I'm also told that the "Saturday Night Socials", were everyone can attend, is also listed included in that \$140K number. Yes, the workers do get to attend, but again to call it a "RWP" is not entirely correct since it is not exclusively for the Race Workers. I am being told that the typical worker, on a race weekend, could receive a gas "voucher" for some \$25.00, along with a drink and a sandwich. And occasionally may get a voucher for hotel room reimbursement.

The main point with this is that the RE, Rick Balderson, used these figures in his August 2008, RE Report, to tell us "times are a changing", and these figures were used as the rationale s for decisions regarding dropping and/ or adding future club events. While I have the utmost respect for our RE, if part of the decision making process to "Drop the Daytona National" in favor of a all regional weekend in May, was based on flawed data, then maybe the resulting decision is also flawed.

The real bottom line is that costs of our racing have gone up, and the region wants to get the biggest bang for its buck. I (we) surely have no issue with that, so I hope that misleading data was not developed to support of a decision. Initially I was willing to jump into the fray, and demand an explanation for any discrepancy. But after careful consideration, I'm going to let this

issue run it's course. Mainly because if becomes a he said / she said issue. And by the time this column is published, the issue, if there is one, will have run it's course and hopefully has been addressed. If not, then surely my feeble attempt will resolve nothing. The vary thought that there is some "erroneous" data floating around speaks more volumes than I could pontificate in this monthly column.

Note: Don't ever try anyone in the court of public opinion. There is nothing worse than be accused of something when you maybe totally innocent. I want to give every side the opportunity to explain them selves. Most of the times, their responses speak volumes about the individual. I will always attempt to be fair and straightforward. But if I have been duped and I find that it was intentional, then I will become very vocal with my opinions and not withhold my views. Enough Said.

Item 3: The CFR Website has a new look, and format. From the brief amount of time I have been able to "walk" through it, I like what I see. I have not had the luxury of spending a lot of time there since I have to depend on France Telecom (which runs at an Escargot pace) and AOL to connect with the Internet while I am Normandy. But the folks responsible should be commended for the new format and layout. Thanks. Please let them know what you think and give them a "Pat on the Back".

On the racing scene:

Well I am the victim of technology ignorance this time. I tried to down load the results from our web-site and lost it with in the depths of my computer. I have been having a difficult time to getting a lot of data and then access it while out of the country. So forgive me but you will just have to go and access the info on your own. I will do better in the future!

Points Race for the 2008 Regional Championship

In 2008, some 109 CFR drivers have competed in Improved Touring. As of September 3rd half of the IT regional championships are still anyone's to win or lose. But there are a few classes that I think that the "Fat Lady" has begun to sing. ITS, ITA, and ITC. There appear to be three drivers dominating those classes.

In ITS it looks that Mike Flynn has the whole thing sealed up with 93 points, twice as many as Scott Richards with 46, and Steve Goldin with 21. Some 26 individuals this year have contested ITS, but Mike Flynn has run away with this class. Looks like total domination to this observer, Mike is Mr. ITS.

In ITA, a very young and talented Andrew Charbonneau has accumulated some 51 points which are double the 21 that Ryan Wyatt has won. Some 30 different drivers have been awarded points in ITA. In third place is Daryl Pritchett with 18. I'm sure that Daryl will be working very hard to get past Ryan before the final races come to an end.

In ITC, Earl Clemenson, with 71 points has, is way ahead of both the next two drivers. Miki Moewold, has 49 points and is one point ahead of Earnest Taylor with 48. I'm sure Miki will have her mirrors full with Earnest trying very hard to move up to the next level on the podium. A total of 18 different drivers contested ITC this year.

In the other three Improved Touring classes the Fat Lady has not even walked into her dressing room. In ITR, IT7, and ITB the story is quite different. The battles are still hot and heavy and the top spots are still up for grabs.

In ITR, Bruce Shafer with 36 points and holds a 9-point lead over Mike Guenther with 27. And hot one his heels are both John Cento and Bob Henderson with 24 points each. If Bruce Shafer fumbles in the next two events then Mike, or John or Bob could take the top spot away. Good Luck to you all. Again some 7 different drivers have completed in ITR. This is Improved Touring's newest class.

In IT-7, Two of the Mazda guys are having a good battle, on top of the leader board is Barry Burgoon, with 64 pts. He is holding an 11-point lead over Jim Welz with 53. Barry has consistently stayed ahead of Jim, and I am sure that is somewhat frustrating to Jim, who will be looking to better his fortune in the future. David McCauley is in third place with 39 points. There have been 10 different drivers pushing their rotary Mazda's to the checkered flag in 2008

In ITB, (I'm somewhat biased), the point's battle changes after each event. Some 18 drivers have competed in ITB. There is a tie at the top of the podium with Mike Horn and George McCormick both with 42 points. There is another McCormick, Mike, some 10

points behind in 3rd. But there are also several other driver's right behind that could break into the top 3 before the year's final event. George is a consistent runner, and Mike Horn's Mustang is quick. With a couple of races left, the ultimate winner of ITB, might not be in the current top 3. I'm sure that Mike Horn and both McCormick's will be working very hard to keep the rest of the field behind them.

Annual Meeting:

The annual meeting is being held in Sebring this year and it is CFR's 50th Anniversary. The dates are December 12-14. If you have not already decided to attend, I earnestly request that you do attend if at all possible. There is a complete schedule on our Web-Site, rates, sign-up's etc. It is the one time of the year that there is a "General Membership" meeting with the District Governors, RE and etc are in attendance, and it is a good time to get your voice heard. There are also other meetings with the various boards where you can speak you mind. It is important. Remember, "Things that don't change, have a tendency to remain the same". If you want things to "maintain the status quo", then don't speak up. Another reason to attend is that there are some 2700 + members in our Region, and new blood is needed to keep us "Going and Growing". So step forward and get involved. In October, you will receive a ballot in the mail for the election of a new Area 3 Board of Director to represent us with "Corporate" (Topeka). Our current director, K.P Jones who has been is our BOD, has decided not to run of re-election. The BOD members are elected for a term of 3 years. There are 3 candidates running for the position. Two are members of the Central Florida Region.

Robin Langlotz, our current race board chairman, who has given a lot of time and effort to the Region. Robin, whom I may not always agree with, had done a good job as RB Chairman.



Lee Hall, a retired businessman from Tampa, has been racing with SCCA for 15 years. I don't believe he has held any positions in the region before, but has a very impressive resume as a business owner and business consultant in the Tampa area.

Bob Ricker, from the Florida Region has also expressed his desire to run. I believe he ran last time against KP Jones. Unfortunately I do not have any information regarding him.

We have two very qualified candidates from CFR running for Area 3 Board of Director. While I am not shy in expressing my opinion (as you know if you read my column) I really struggled with whether I should or should not declare whom I would support in this election. I have given this a great deal of thought, but I am going to support Lee Hall. I have known Robin for many years and truly believe that he has the region's best interests at heart. But I think it is time for a change. I have only recently come to know Lee. It is through this column and his fight to keep the Daytona National on the Region's calendar. I like his tenacity and analytical approach to get his message across to the powers to be. I like his "business" mentality and experience, which I believe has been lacking with of the current decision-making processes and decisions. I also believe Lee will "communicate" his positions and better keep us informed as to the direction of SCCA and our region's interests. Lee is also someone who brings "New Blood" to the club, that we so severely need to change the status quo. Therefore, when I receive my ballot for Area 3 Board of Directors, I will be voting for Lee Hall. I hope vou will vote for Lee also.

Pete Keane and the ITAC:

Last month, Pete Keane, the CRB Liaison to the ITAC, graciously and quickly responded to some of questions regarding the operation of the CRB and the ITAC. A question that I asked him, after his initial response, was regarding "term limits" for members of the IT Advisory Committee. He indicated to me that basically there were no term limits so to speak, but most members stay on for some 4

years and new members would be added when a vacancy occurs from a list of resumes that have been submitted. Pete also stated that it is the responsibility of the ITAC to "stay in touch" with the IT community and make recommendations to the CRB. A question that I have now is "without having an "official" IT site / forum within SCCA to collect members opinions, ideas, gripes, etc., how does the ITAC "stay in touch" with the IT competitors. I'm not talking about the rule change process, it is fairly well understood. The ITAC is seems to be appointed to represent various geographic areas of the country. The South has two members on the ITAC. One is Les Chaney, out of Eden, NC. the other is Lee Graser from Andersonville. Tennessee. I'm don't remember either one of these gentlemen asking me for my inputs. Have any one of you heard from either of these ITAC members? There is no committee member from one of the largest Improved Touring areas, and that is Area 3, which I believe contains more of more Improved Touring cars and drivers than almost any other Area. I could be wrong. I think there is a "hole" in the process that needs to be filled. Why does not Area 3 have a member on the ITAC? I would like to see that changed very soon. Maybe our new BOD will see that! The current members are not elected from a list of candidates whom we can vote on to support our views. Would we be better served if the "ITAC" was elected and not appointed? This group of "appointed" folks are making some strategic decisions that could affect the future costs of Improved Touring. Would we be better served if there were term limits for this committee? Right now, I can only "hope" that they are looking out for my / our best interests. Oops-- "Hope is not a Strategy" Just Food for thought. Pete any comments?

While we are in here, we have been taking some side trips to other countries. Last month we went England for a week and were in the Midlands (Birmingham) area. Last week, Toni and I went to Belgium just to see the country. (I did not remember that the Belgium Grand Prix was being held at Spa Francochamps, so I missed it). Bastogne, they have renamed the main square in the town after the US General McAuliffe, who responded to the German Commander whom asked for Americans to surrender, with the answer "Nuts". We even had lunch at a brasserie called the "Nuts Café". Just some trivia. From Bastogne, we went to the French city of Reims (pronounced like "Rence"). Now I understand where Sebring's Alec Ulhman got his model our old pit road. Reims and the Pre-Panoz Sebring pits were somewhat carbon copies of each other. I just guess that was the state of the practice for road racing after WWII.

Conclusion





Vintage Races

Sebring, FI. The SCCA Labor Day Memorial was held at Sebring International Raceway, on August 30 and 31, and was run on the 3.70 mile long course. Saturdays practice and qualifying sessions for vintage, was run under sunny skies with a slight overcast. But during the night the outer bands from hurricane Gustav started coming over Sebring and continued most of the day, Sunday. The vintage race was the first race of the morning, on a track that had areas of standing water, as well as many wet section where the pavement changed to a concrete race surface.

Carl Bussard #31 1969 Corvette and Steve Smith in the #36 Lotus Elan.






