R.E. Report

There were several 'hot button' items on the agenda at the recent SEDiv mid-year meeting. The issue getting the most attention was the spec tire rule for the Miata crowd. The outcome on that was that the Divisional races, i.e. SARRC and ECR, will follow the national rules with regard to the spec tire rules. At CFR races we will have the supps written to allow the competitors to choose the tire they wish to run.

Another really important issue was in the scheduling portion of our discussions.

The SEDiv July 4th double National was in financial trouble and it did not appear that the 2010 version was going to have a different outcome, so, the Division voted to hold a double SARRC and a double ECR at Roebling Road on that weekend.

Closer to home, CFR will be hosting a Double National on the weekend of January 8, 9, 10, 2010, with two track test days Jan. 6th & 7th.

On the first weekend of 2010, the 1st, 2nd & 3rd, Florida Region will be hosting a Double National at Homestead with a test day on Dec. 31st. The Quad Winter Nationals should prove to be quite the deal.

The customers of CFR, the competitors, have asked the region to be more GCR compliant with regard to the CFR rule of not allowing shorts on the grid or the non-hot side of the pit wall. Be sure to check the supps in upcoming events to see how the details on this issue transpire.

I had planned on writing a recap of our August 8th & 9th double SARRC and was originally thinking about the chamber of commerce weather we enjoyed and the lack of official police patrols through our areas. Unfortunately, the event was overshadowed by several serious accidents, with injuries, the likes of which CFR has rarely seem. Reverend Steve Kearney has had his hands full with this event, and we thank him for the time taken to address the needs of our members who were injured, their families and friends. Times like these show who we really are and what matters to us and our members.

Moving right along, CFR had another meeting with Daytona regarding a building coupled with the "overnight parking" deal. Because, as you know, Daytona does Not have camping, only overnight parking. home on Wednesday, Aug. 19, 2009 after a two year battle with throat cancer. Born Oct. 27, 1953 in Chicago, IL to the late Albert and Amaret Moll. Terri was a 1971 graduate of Prospect High School, Mt. Prospect, IL. She moved to Central Florida that same year and became a member of the opening team for Walt Disney World, working at the preview center as a preview guide, and later as editor of internal publications, including "Eyes & Ears." While working at Disney, Terri continued her education, receiving a degree in Radio Television/Journalism from the University of Central Florida in 1975. She juggled work and school, but also found time to become an active member of Zeta Tau Alpha sorority and serving as president of the Kappa Sigma little sisters. After ten years with Disney, Terri joined Red Lobster, working in the offices of training, development and communications before taking time off to raise her children. Instead of returning to the corporate world, Terri joined The South Lake Press as a reporter, earning the 1990 Central Florida Press Club First Place Award for Best Weekly Column. She then spent several years as a correspondent covering the south Lake community for the Lake Sentinel edition of the The Orlando Sentinel. In 1996, Terri joined the ranks of educators and has since served as an English teacher and literacy coach at Windy Hill Middle School and South Lake High School, where she was named teacher of the year for 2001. Terri was an active member of St. Matthias Episcopal Church where she served as Lector, a member of the Tomoka Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, and former member and past president of the Clermont Junior Woman's Club where she received the 1993 Charlotte Meads Smith Volunteer of the year award and helped bring the club national recognition with a Chevron Corporation award for outstanding community improvement for the construction of Park Pals Playground. She was a member of the Central

Florida Region-Sports Car Club of America, where her primary role was serving as pit crew for her husband Steve. In addition, Terri worked timing and scoring at regional and national events, served as past editor of The Checker and received the CFR-SCCA Worker of the year award. She also covered regional and national races as a correspondent for SportsCar magazine. A devout life-long Cubs fan, Terri cheered them on despite defeat year after year. The most important part of her life, however, was her 30 year marriage to Stephen and her sons, Randy, Jordan, and Spencer, all of Montverde, to whom she was devoted to. Regardless of her work responsibilities or volunteer commitments, their needs were always her number one priority. She loved being involved and sitting on the sidelines of all their activities, whether it was watching them play various sports or sitting in the audience or working as a "roadie" for their bands when they performed. In addition to her husband and sons, Terri is survived by her brother, Jeff W. Moll (Joanne) of Hilton Head Island, SC: and her sister Elizabeth W. Curtis (Scott) of Comer. Georgia. As always at a Daytona race, there was a huge field of over 300 cars with several groups in excess of 70 or 80 cars. The weather was hot and the racing even hotter. Congratulations to the winners and good job to all.

There were the usual fender bender incidents but two that involved injuries to drivers. During Saturday's practice / qualifying, a car ended up head into the guard rail at Turn Four. The driver suffered a compound fracture of his leg and went via ambulance to the hospital for surgery to treat his leg.

The second very serious incident occurred on Sunday, in which Pit Lane workers immediately went to the Driver's assistance with fire bottles and the ambulance, medical, fire personnel and emergency crews were instantly dispatched.

Please keep both drivers and their families in your thoughts and prayers -CFR folks are really family and we all bond together in times of need. Chaplain Steve Kearney handled details for both drivers, going to the hospital with both, proving support, and serving as liaison with the families and Stewards. Chaplain Steve is a valued member of our CFR family. All of us who have needed and received Chaplain Steve's care are most grateful that he is always there for us.

Right after the Sunday incident, the Red Flag was shown. Drivers deserve lots of praise for responding to it as quickly as possible and for pulling to the edge of the track in single file. Remember, always pull to the outside edges of the track on the paved surface and be sure to leave the center of the track clear to allow emergency vehicles to get through quickly. The rule says to pull to the edge of the track as quickly as you can safely do so with the emphasis on safely.... and everyone did just that. Remember, it is permissible to pass a car that pulls over right in front of you to avoid hitting him or her. Red Flags are followed by Black Flags when the track is clear. Go to the pits and will be re-gridded in the order you last passed Timing and Scoring.

NEW EXPERIENCE: Hopefully, new skills. I entered the wonderful world of Logging. at the Drivers' School in Sebring and I figured I'd start with small fields. I am working on 'Old' (not my favorite word) Dogs CAN learn New Tricks. My thanks to all in the Tower, Chief Communicators, Stewards, T&S gang and, of course, the official Loggers during the School. You were all

great... helpful, and, most important, patient! And you even asked me back to work the Daytona Double SARRC.

And then there was Daytona. Again, the Tower Stewards and Logging folks were very kind and helpful. Saturday Jan Rawls did double duty, serving as a Chief Communicator and backing me up. It was great seeing Jan, Ron and a familiar voice from the past, John Schnedl. The view from 'on high' at Daytona is spectacular My only problem was that trying to keep up with what was going on on-track kept my eyes glued to the log sheets... while my mind went ' who did what... to whom... and where?!' However all Corner Communicators did a great job with their calls and call arounds. Thanks to you too. With that many cars, it got really busy at times. The Endurance Award goes to the Grid Group and the Pit Crew.. they sure earned their 'pay' all weekend, handling the large groups and re-gridding when necessary.

I know that when I was doing Corner Working duties, the beginning of sessions or races with large numbers of cars always got me really, really watching for numbers when I was communicating. I thought it would be nice if they'd just slow down and pass me single file so I could keep track. However, there were times when even that wouldn't have helped. My classic was at a Daytona 24-hour in the wee small hours of the night. It was the first time they had lights in the infield so you stood a fighting chance of being able to spot numbers. I was at Turn Five and a big car with big numbers went into the tire wall close to me... and ended up number facing me, right under a light. I was thrilled until my mouth said.... Turn 57, (oops, that was the car number!) Standing Yellow. Sometimes you just can't save me from myself! When I was in school, trying to study between the hours of 3-am and 5 am, I discovered that I turn into a zombie - my teeth get pointy, my hands get hairy and my brain turns into library paste. Mindless tasks I'm good for, but everyday rational thought is nonexistent.
