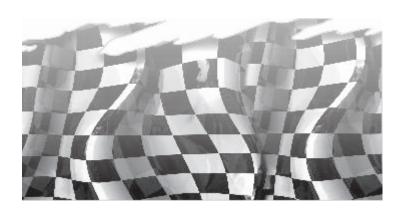

Turning the Corner

Hello again, it is June and there are a couple of things that I have to write about this month.

First item of course is the "The Daytona Classic". Unlike past years, the Classic no longer includes CFR's 2nd National event. Our 2nd National of the year was part of the Double at Sebring in January. You remember, CFR's version of the "Refrigerator Bowl"! But for the regional racers, we again got to experience the high banks at the World Center of Racing. If you missed the event, too bad. It is the last time this year we could use the track. As most of you know, Daytona will be repaved after the July NASCAR and our August and September events for Daytona have been cancelled. More details will come from the Race Board.

The second item I want to talk about hit a little closer to home, I don't like to talk about myself in this column, because "Turning the Corner" is about IT racers and our triumphs and tribulations. But when I feel it is appropriate, I will share some of my experiences, especially if I feel that our IT community might benefit. I had an unfortunate experience at Daytona. Maybe you have shared a similar experience and you will understand. But more about that later.

The Daytona Classic

Our event had about 300 entered. But, I guess due to the economy, more IT cars were entered at our February event. Some folks, who entered the Enduro, did not enter the regionals, and visa versa. I wonder if the race board should try to find out why?

Saturday--The group 1 Enduro Qualifying included the ITB & ITC cars. There were some 8 ITB cars entered along with 5 ITC. We qualified bright and early on Saturday morning. Pete Keane won the ITB pole in his Honda Accord with a time of 1:26.995. Jason Hoepenbecker qualified his Mazda Protégé 2nd in ITB with a time of 1:29.653. Third in ITB was Steve Taylor's MkII VW Golf with a time of 2:30.897. Deuce Keane, the 2008 & 2009 ARRC ITB Champion experienced mechanical problems in qualifying and was finished for the weekend. This was a surprise. I know that Deuce had done a lot of work on his car since having some mechanical difficulties at the Cabin Cure regional in February. In ITC, the VW Scirocco of Chuck Mecklem won the pole with a time of 2:33.999. Bill McCoin qualified 2nd in his Ford Fiesta with a time of 2.37.432 Qualifying 3rd in ITC was Miki Moerwald, just a tick behind McCoin, with a time of 2:37.591 in her VW Rabbit.

Just a short note. Due to our back of the grid qualifying position, John Robinson and I got to meet a "newbie" to IT racing. Thomas Harrison entered the Enduro in his 1980? ITC Honda Civic. This was Tom's first road race. He and his son were very up beat but realistic about their ride. Tom has some prior racing experience but is new to road racing. Tom, we welcome you and your son to the IT family. Look forward to seeing you at the races. Good Luck to you.

Group 2 Enduro Qualifying included the ITR, ITS, ITA and IT7 cars.

For the Group 2 folks, the ITS Mercedes of Irish Mike Flynn took the overall pole for the Group 2 with a time of 2:15.077. Mike said he had not had the Mercedes out in some time but it was up to it's usual fast form. 2nd in ITS was the Mark Nasrallah with a time of 2:17.723. Third was Steve Goldin, with a time of 2:18171. Winning the pole in ITR was the BMW of Felix Serrallos with a time of 2:15.483, just a tick behind Irish Mike. Second in ITR was Mike Guenther in his BMW also just a fraction off the pole winning ITR car, with a time of 2:15.736. Third in ITR was Mark Weeder with a time of 2:21.942. Quickest in ITA was the was Thomas Free with a time of 2:22.702, but Mary Katharine was barely beaten with a time of 2:22.843 in Paul Ronie's Acura. Third in ITA was Wesley Saunders with a time of 2:25. 505. Only one IT-7 entered the Enduro and that was Robert Iversen with a time of 2:41.010

Group 5 Qualifying—The "big" bore IT cars made up Group 5, ITR, ITS, ITA and IT7. Originally ITB was also included in this group, but due to a scheduling issue and the Enduro, ITB was moved to Group 7. Just as with the Enduro qualifying, Felix Serrallos put his ITR BMW on the pole with a time of 2:13.009. Over 2 seconds quicker than his qualifying time for the Enduro. Again 2nd in ITR was Mike Guenther, but his qualifying time of 2:15.349 was comparable with his Enduro time. Third in ITR was Aaron Nash with a time of 2:22.293. Winning the ITS pole was Steve Goldin with a time of 2:18.225., but Scott Seck was right there in 2nd with a time of 2:18.393. Mike Conrad qualified 3rd in ITS with a time of 2:21.875. Winning the ITA pole was Bob Sieck's Mazda with a time of 2:23.704, but the 2nd place ITA car of Thomas Free tried to match Bob's time with a 2:23.989. Darryl Pritchett was 3rd in ITA in his Neon with a time of 2:25:542. The IT-7 guys did come for the Regional with Drake Burgoon taking the IT-7 pole with a time of 2:29:505. Jim Welz came close to Drake's time with a qualifying time of 2:29.782. Third in IT-7 qualifying was Kenneth Walters with a time of 2:30.371.

Group 7 Qualifying—ITB & ITC were included in Group 7, along with SM, SSB, & SSC, STU & some NASA cars. In ITB, yours truly had the fastest ITB time with 2:26.463 in our MkIII VW Jetta. We recovered from the morning's problem. Second in ITB was Steve Taylor in his MkII VW Golf with a time of 2:32.644, and third in ITB was the Paul McCormick in his MkIII Golf with a time of 2:35.766. Unfortunately, Paul lost an engine and was through for the weekend. This was the second ITB car that would not be racing at Daytona this weekend. In ITC, Chuck Mecklem won his second pole with a time of 2:34.914 in his Scirocco. Miki Moerwald put her VW Rabbit in the 2nd spot in ITC with a time of 2:36.751, and Bill McCoin grabbed the 3rd ITC spot with a time of 2.37.066 in his Ford Fiesta.

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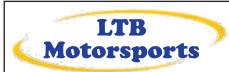
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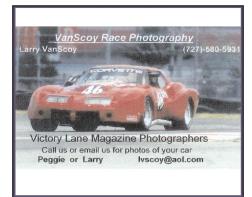
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Awareness month, held our Third Annual Autism Awareness
