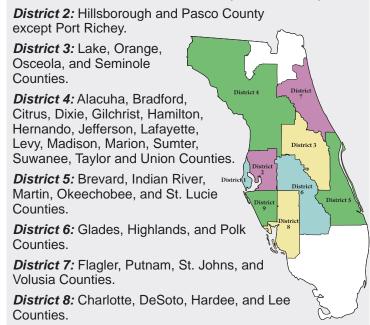

...From the BOG Chair

The General Membership Meeting and last meeting of CFR's BOG for 2010 were held December 11-12 at our Annual Meeting in Gainesville.

Welcome to Terry Taylor as the new Governor for District 6. The Board thanks outgoing Governor, Berta Sager for her service. The Governors of Districts 2, 4 and 8 are continuing in their positions.

As the re-elected Chairman of your BOG, I would like to express my appreciation for the support and confidence of the Board. Bob Sieck was re-elected Vice Chairman, Jim Magero was approved as Financial Advisor and Robin Langlotz/Robin Ragaglia approved as Race Board Chairmen. Chuck Lutz is our new Solo Chairman and Doug McCabe is our new Rally Chairman.

To summarize:

Competition Coordinator - Bill Martin – Our signed 2010 contract with Sebring has been received. We expect receipt of the Daytona contract this month. Last year our volunteers continued to support professional racing events at Daytona, Sebring and St. Pete as well as test days and the Brumos 250. The Region thanks Bill Cannons and his cadre of workers from the east coast who supported these additional events at Daytona.

Financial - Jim Magero, Financial Advisor, provided a portfolio review document and reported that CFR's portfolio showed a positive return over the past ten years. Our Treasurer, Robin Ragaglia, provided reports to the Governors including Balance Sheets and a Statement of Revenue and Expenses. Our operating income is directly tied to entry fees. Solo is maintaining good income. We need to continue to be cost conscious and plan for major expenditures.

Membership - Joyce Hayward – reported that CFR membership has declined from this time last year. Our Area III Director, Robin Langlotz, reported that our membership was at 2230 as of Oct. 2010 – a loss of about 6% for the year.

Race Board - Robin Langlotz - We are on program with our traditional dates and groupings for 2011 and will start the year with a Double National at Sebring, January 7-9. We have seen a slight increase in car counts in last three events – primarily in SM and SRF with the IT cars following. Our endurance series replaces ECR events.

RE – Chuck Dawson – Some of the sponsors for our Double National are Appalachian Tire, Sunoco Fuel and Hoosier Tires. The SRF event within the Double National will be called the Dakota Donovan Memorial. Thanks to Al Harhay for initiating the idea and Pam McGregor for spearheading the very successful Gail Kasson Memorial dinner at our Turkey Trot event. We fed 200 plus and there

was plenty of food for all. We are working with the Florida Region to develop the Tropical Endurance Series. It is hoped this partnership will help improve entries for both regions.

Solo - Tim Reardon – Solo continued its active program on both East and West coasts. Combining the championships improved the participant level at the Brooksville site. This year there were 24 events averaging 51 cars per event and we now have wireless timing gear. We conducted two Tire Rack Street Survival events and supported the Autism Awareness charity with an event and donation of around \$1200. Current plans for 2011 are to hold two solo events at Daytona in conjunction with other CFR activities. In the planning stages is a PDX to be run at the April Drivers School at Daytona. In 2011 we expect to hold the same number of events as in 2010.

Other Items of Interest:

2011 Annual Meeting – site TBA.

2011 BOG dates are March 12th – Sebring; June 18th – TBD; September 10th - Orlando I4/Hwy.27 and December 11th - TBD.

AS A NEW YEARS RESOLUTION - it's time to check that gear. Essentials like rain gear, preferably with no rips or tears, extra scanner batteries, sunscreen and mosquito 'stuff'... and be sure to add any medicines you might need, and a medication list in case of accident. Be sure to add aspirin to your med list if you take it regularly - that's important for any medical personnel to know. Also throw out any left over snacks you have in your gear ... if you didn't eat them last year, it's a good bet you won't even consider consuming them now - all they're good for is ant bait. Last year's sun screen needs to be replaced too - It doesn't improve with age. It should be broad spectrum with a minimum SPF of 30 for adequate protection. Check for an expiration date on the container or label.

When I first started Corner Working, the Chief suggested carrying dry socks in your gear bag or bucket. Whereas this sounds like a good idea, I found it is an exercise in futility. So you have dry socks which you put on wet feet, compounded by the wet shoes you have to stuff your feet into. Scratch the socks idea. Remember for the 24 hour and the 12 hour, we'll have many Northern folks working with us... remind them to use the aforementioned sunscreen early and often and share yours if needed. They're not used to a sunburn in midwinter.

'TWAS THE SEASON: With the Turkey Trot race on the long course at Sebring, every pair of hands and feet were appreciated. The race was our swan song for the season and we had one whole month off before the Nationals in January.

This year in memory of Gail Kasson, we initiated a pot luck dinner ... and all that participated in the event from set up to clean up are thanked as well as everyone bringing food to share. It was a real family event which would have brought a smile to Gail's face. I know she'll be with us in spirit always, just as she was in life.

Remembering Gail, makes me think of a saying that illustrates her life... " if you throw a pebble into a still pond, ripples extend far out influencing everything in their path." What we do, say and are makes an impact on many more people than we can ever imagine. That was Gail's life and in the words of Christopher Robin "you're braver than you believe, stronger than you seem, and smarter than you think."

TIPS FOR ROOKIES...REMINDERS FOR VETS: For Pro Races where you're on station for many hours... don't neglect your own comfort. Heavy rain/strong winds, heat and cold have to be taken into consideration. Not only will you be more comfortable and happy, but you'll be more efficient too. Here are some tips (thanks to Assistant Flag Chief, Jim Hooker... and from my own experience). To keep your head and hat dry, get a large shower cap... or

snag one from your motel. It will fit over your hat and probably over the brim, and maybe over your headset too. To keep yourself in the loop, cover the mike with a small plastic bag or balloon when you communicate.

As for Victory of da' feet ... save the plastic bags that come with your newspaper. One size truly does fit all. Slip them over your dry socks and use rubber bands or tape to hold them up. Stuff your feet suitably protected into your shoes. It all goes well, you'll be humming 'how dry am I' I also spray my shoes and any canvas gear bags with Camp Dry water repellant spray. I can't guarantee how well any of these things work, but hey, you have the satisfaction of knowing you're tried everything possible to avoid feeling wet and miserable.

READ IT AND WEEP - For all RV or Motor Home owners: Jerry went to fill the RV gas tank for the Turkey Trot weekend. Shortly thereafter he called the RV had stopped dead, in the middle of the road for no good and apparent reason. I asked if he could get it to the side of the road. As he put it 'no way can I push this (expletive deleted) over to the side by myself.'

He said 'who do I call?' Now you know, the first reply that popped into my head wasghost busters but I wisely refrained from that answer. I told him where the card and info were and he couldn't find it. OK, I said "let me look and I'll give you the number to call... got a pencil?" No writing tool was available. I then said I'd call and have them call him (if he wasn't dead from being hit and toppled in the road). I located the RV emergency road service card and made the call.

Gail Kasson was named to the CFR Hall of Fame for her many contributions to the club during the many years she was a member. Jan Rawls and Greg Kasson, her daughter and son, accepted the award on behalf of their mother and Jan shared stories of working with and for Gail.

Randy Probst, well known local driver and noted pro driver, was the quest speaker and did a great job. Randy told of his starting to race locally in the SOLO program and confirmed that SOLO drivers often made the best race car drivers. He ended his presentation with an interesting observation. 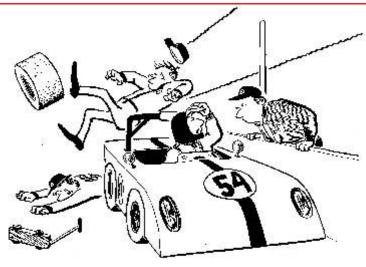

Vintage Rules! (& Regulations)

VINTAGE CLASS RULE CHANGES

Starting with the CFR February 2011 regional race, a new set of car prep rules for Vintage cars will be effective with the major change being raising the cutoff date from cars manufactured in 1972 to those produced through 1985. All cars in the group from '72 to '85 will however have to be prepared to SCCA standards for 1972. Basically, this means modifications will be limited to what we currently refer to as IT rules, in reference to body mods, engine prep, tires, etc.

Central Florida region along with Florida region are currently the only SCCA SE division regions running Vintage races on a regular basis. We have a very committed, but small group, of active drivers and are hopeful that allowing newer cars will increase our entry numbers and still maintain the vintage race philosophy. I might touch on that for a moment. I have raced in SCCA since the mid '60's in a variety of classes and currently race a '69 Porsche 911 in Vintage. For those of you who view Vintage as a parade of old cars, I can assure you that is not the case. The intensity of CFR Vintage racing is just as high as any other class with one exception, which is that we strive to drive in a manner to eliminate all body contact.

We welcome drivers who have the ability to run competitively and at the same time have their race car under complete control. Drivers with "a win at all cost mentality" are discouraged from running in SCCA Vintage racing.

You can race in the Vintage class with any SCCA license, national, regional, vintage of novice. We also accept SCCA members with a VMC license.

Another significant rule change is we now accept dual eligible cars. Cars can run in the vintage class and any other class they are eligible for as long as they meet Vintage requirements.

Vintage races for 2011 are as follows:

CENTRAL FLORIDA & FLORIDA REGIONS VINTAGE COMPETITION VEHICLE PREP RULES VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY:

- 1. All production based cars manufactured through 1985, but prepared to no later than 1972 specs.
- 2. Sports Racers manufactured through 1972.
- 3. Formula cars manufactured through 1972, except as follows:
 - a. Club Ford as defined by SCCASE Division rules.
 - b. FV only through 1969.

DRIVERS LICENSING: As specified in the events listed supplemental regulations or an SCCA member with VMC member club license.

DUAL ELIGIBLE CARS: Cars eligible for both vintage racing and some other class are allowed. However, the car must conform to ALL Vintage regulations and the driver racing in the Vintage class must be approved by the Vintage driver representatives.

OTHER SAFETY EQUIPMENT: Many other topics such as driver restraints, driver's gear, window nets, arm restraints, fuel cells, etc, are no longer listed here as they are adequately covered in the SCCA General Competition Rules (GCR). The GCR is available on line to both SCCA members and the general public. Listed here are topics either not satisfactorily covered for vintage cars or for which our rules are different.

ROLL BARS: Per Appendix Z of the vintage Competition Rules. Minimum requirements consist of a Main Hoop and one or two rearward support tubes. Subject to the approval of Tech inspection, tubing size per current GCR. Roll cages are allowed and encouraged...

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS: All cars must be equipped with a dry chemical fire extinguisher of at least 2 lbs securely mounted in the cockpit or an onboard fire system per current GCR.

BODY: No modifications from original, such as contemporary flares, spoilers or air dams are permitted. The use of substitute materials such as aluminum or fiberglass in the place of steel solely for the purpose of vehicle weight reduction is not allowed, unless car was



WHEELS: Cars must run on wheels of the same size as were made available from the manufacturer at the time. Reference is made to rim width, diameter and offset as specified in the manufacturer"s homologation statement. A rim width of up to +1½" wider may be used for safety purposes. Wheel diameter may also vary 1" in either direction to accommodate tire availability.

TIRES: Full treaded racing tires or DOT radials with a minimum of 2/32 tread depth and a minimum marked aspect ratio of 45. Radial slicks or any of the following are prohibited: Goodyear 05/CS, Hoosier DOT radial, Kumho V710 and other cheater slicks DOT tire. Sports racers and formula cars may run on slicks if they had done so prior to 1972. FF, CF and FV must use treaded tires.

ENGINE: The entrant must certify the correct engine displacement. The entrant shall have the option of fitting any substitute engine providing that size/type engine was used during that specific vehicle's competition history and during the dates of the car's vintage eligibility. In the spirit of historic preservation and fair play, participants will assume responsibility for keeping their equipment as close to original as possible.

IGNITION: Ignition system must be the original type as raced. MSD-type systems may be used in place of original CD boxes, but distributor-type systems must remain in place. Crank-fire ignition systems are specifically disallowed.

SUSPENSION: All steering and suspension components will be properly fitted with no excessive wear or play. The system of suspension (spring type and number) must not be altered nor shall additional location or springing devices be added unless a factory option. No coil-overs unless the car was homolgated or originally fitted with such shocks. Tube type shocks may be substituted for lever action type. Sway bars and bushings are free.

TOWING EYES: Per current GCR.

BRAKES: Braking system must be per the year of homologation for the vehicle mode. Dual master cylinders may be used for safety purposes. Disc brakes are permitted when it can be shown they were available as a regular production option during the year of homologation. Brakes must be original size and manufacture as raced.

MODIFICATIONS: Any modification to engine, body, suspension or brakes updates the vehicle eligibility date to the year that modification was available for that specific vehicle and could make the vehicle ineligible for vintage competition.

GENERAL:

- A securely fastened catch tank with a minimum capacity of 1 qt. each is required for both engine and radiator. (if used).
- Each carburetor must have its own throttle return spring in addition to the single linkage spring.
- · Under trays must have drain holes
- Wheels must be free of cracks and faults.
- Wire wheels: Spokes must be properly tensioned with no broken or missing spokes.
- No oil, fuel, water of fluid leads of any king will be tolerated.
- All cars must be fitted with at least one brake light in working order. Formula cars excepted
- All fuel filler caps must be securely fastened so as not to open on impact. Monza type (quick release) caps must be wired shut.
- Batteries must be securely fastened down. Those located in the cockpit must be covered or have leak proof caps. All terminals will be adequately protected from the possibility of electrical shorts.
- Cars must be presented in a neat and finished condition. Engine compartment, suspension, chassis and driveline must be clean enough to facilitate inspection. Cables, wires and hoses must be taped or otherwise secured to prevent chafing, etc.
- All cars must display legible numbers and SCCA decals on both sides of the vehicle. SCCA "Wire Wheel" decal is acceptable in Vintage. Florida Regions "Vintage Racing" sticker is recommended as class designation.
- All cars must use an working AMB transponder. Failure to do so will result in no lap times or lap counts being taken or scored.

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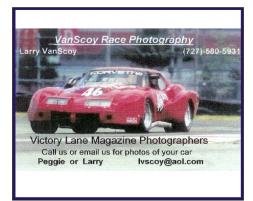
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
